



What is Honesty?

Honesty is being truthful in what you say and in what you do. When you are honest, you say what really happened and you do things in a truthful way, so you don't do things that trick or cheat people.


For each set of pictures, check the box in the circle to show if the action is honest or dishonest.


The child admitted to eating the cookies. They told the truth which is being honest.


Being honest means you tell the whole truth. If you hide the truth, you are not being honest.

What is Honesty?

Honesty is being truthful in what you say and in what you do. When you are honest, you say what really happened and you do things in a truthful way, so you don't do things that trick or cheat people.


For each set of pictures, check the box in the circle to show if the action is honest or dishonest.



The child took something without paying for it, which is stealing. Stealing is a type of cheating and it is dishonest.

Being honest means you don't try to trick or cheat people. Taking things without paying for them is called stealing, and that is not honest.

The child is hiding the truth that they are reading when they are supposed to be sleeping. Even though they didn't tell a lie (when they didn't answer the question), they were still being deceitful (tricking someone) which is dishonest.

Being honest means you are truthful in your actions. Hiding your actions when you know they are wrong is dishonest (not honest).
